Now, Feed My People provides over \$4 million in food and other assistance each year in the South County and Northern Jefferson County areas and serves over 4k meals annually. Feed My People has grown to be one of the largest food pantries and social service agencies in the St. Louis region. In addition to food, the agency also provides a variety of services and programs serving people of all ages and backgrounds. Feed My People serves not only to feed the hungry but also to improve the quality of life for the people they serve.





COVID-19 Impact on Feed My People

While Covid-19 brought many businesses to a screeching halt in early March 2020, Feed My People initiated innovative ways to continue serving those who needed help. To keep customers and our loyal staff and front-line volunteers safe, guidelines were implemented for masking, social distancing, sanitizing carts and work areas, all while not missing one scheduled service day.

The Thrift Stores at Feed My People did close their doors until CDC and County guidelines were issued. Before reopening in June, the South County store underwent a major renovation. We cannot thank our amazing community partners enough for supporting Feed My People during these troubling times!

- \$3,380,656.23 in food was donated from individuals, churches, organizations, Operation Food Search and St. Louis Area Food Bank.
- Provided ongoing access to school supplies for all client families with children.
- 1243 families received food and Christmas gifts through the Adopt-a-Family program.
- 969 Clients and family members were provided a free shopping experience at the Elf Shop in High Ridge or the Giving Tree Room in South County.

The Thrifty Hanger Thrift Stores at Feed My People serve not only as a community resource but as a client program for those we serve.

The low-cost items, which are all donated, are a great commodity for those living at or below the poverty line and help meet the needs of those we serve. Clients, who have special needs beyond the discounted pricing are issued vouchers for interview clothing, household needs, clothing for children and family, etc.

The Thrifty Hanger Thrift Stores at Feed My People is also a welcoming environment for those in the community and serves as a regular stop for many customers and clients each day. The customers and clients become a familiar face and an extension of the Feed My People family, many of whom have been shopping with us for many years.

Donations of clothing and shoes for the family, books, home décor, and household items are punctuated with new items, holiday merchandise, jewelry, and small electronics. Often, The Thrifty Hanger is a one-stop shopping destination for those clients of the food pantry.
